WV churches to take ‘Day2Pray’ for state, leaders

Hundreds of churches participate in time of prayer, thanksgiving

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – On Sunday, Jan. 10, thousands of West Virginians will gather in churches across the state to pray for politicians ahead of the opening of the 2010 legislative session. The Family Policy Council of West Virginia, organizer of the “Day2Pray,” is calling on Christians throughout the state to intercede on behalf of the state and nation.

“As citizens of West Virginia, we owe our leaders our active support. As citizens of heaven, we owe them our prayers,” said Jeremy Dys, president of the FPCWV. “If we want the leaders we elected to find wisdom at a time such as this, we should pray that God will give it to them.”

According to Dys, the day is described as a chance for West Virginians to spend less time criticizing politicians and more time praying for their moral character.
